		This will be a non-progressive class intended for novice handlers/dogs not able to make an agility class in the morning and for handlers seeking an opportunity to sample agility/expose their companion to the equipment. Games and exercises will be designed purely for fun and not for a handler that wants to develop a competitive dog.			
		HOOPS AGILITY — Jim Gregg			
		This will be a non-progressive class that will use hoops and tunnels arranged in a novice/open level sequence. It is intended for senior dogs and dogs with jumping restrictions such as young dogs. Instruction will be minimal. Others may participate once the senior and junior dogs have completed their runs.			
		AGILITY GAMES — Kelly Armstrong, Clyde Closson, Frankie Joiris			
		This will be a non-progressive class with a different game offered each day to include Gamblers, Snooker, FAST, and Jumpers. This class is intended for handlers preparing for or already competing in agility.			

INTRODUCTORY AGILITY — Dog and handler have never been exposed to agility obstacles OR have had limited training and experience in obstacle performance. Fundamental obstacle performance skills will be introduced. All work is on-lead.

BEGINNER AGILITY — Dog and handler have completed some agility training but need a refresher OR more work on one or more obstacles. Dog and handler are able to complete a sequence of several obstacles and the dog is beginning to work off-lead. Fundamental course handling skills will be introduced.

INTERMEDIATE AGILITY — Dog can successfully perform all obstacles with confidence and the dog and handler are able to complete a sequence of seven or more obstacles with reasonable focus while working off-lead. Handler is interested in solidifying the partnership and expanding the skills required to orchestrate a smooth flow through a sequence of obstacles. Fundamental course management will be introduced as well as course challenges such as side changes, obstacle discrimination, call-offs, and distance work.

ADVANCED AGILITY — Dog has mastered all the obstacles and works off-lead in a confident and responsive manner. Dog and handler can routinely negotiate a complete novice level course and the handler is ready to develop and/or refine the advanced skills and the course management expertise required to analyze and complete technical sequences and their transitions. Technical sequences will be presented to discuss the handling options and develop/practice the movement/skills required to successfully perform the sequence as a team in optimum partnership.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

HAVING FUN WITH SHOW OBEDIENCE: NOVICE EXERCISES

Will cover Attention, with increased distractions, all of the AKC Novice exercises, including Stays. On Thursday and Friday, I plan to cover some of the Open exercises (drop-on-recall, retrieve — or eat — on the flat, retrieve (or eat) over the high jump, broad jump) by teaching handlers how to train these exercises by using food rewards, targets and games.

Obedience for Agility: Basic behaviors of Sit, Down, Stand, Stay and Come will be reviewed. Attention technique will be covered. Techniques and games will be practiced to improve dog's attention and response to handler's requests. Teams will apply their improved skills to jumps, tunnel and pause tables.
